LIFE TIP: For those of us engaged in land stewardship, forest therapy may simply be a way of life. Immersing in nature walks during this changing season can ground you through memory of why and what you love in conservation, give you space and time to grieve and let go of a job or an imagined career that no longer holds the same luster, while keeping you connected to the land and place that makes you whole. Here is an interesting story about <u>forest therapy and the trauma response</u>.

Reforestation Program Coordinator (deadline March 28)

Land restoration and rehabilitation has never been more important. NM Forestry Division is seeking to fill this critical role in expanding reforestation capacity in New Mexico and restoring wildfire-impacted landscapes. This is a full-time benefitted position (\$29.58-\$47.33 p/hr) with interviews starting within two week of application deadline. This position will implement the reforestation strategy as outlined in the <u>2020 Forest Action Plan</u>.

New Mexico Wildfire Crews: <u>Pecos River and Mimbres Crews</u>

As the Mogote Hill fire in Wagon Mound recently demonstrated, we need more of wildland firefighters. Multiple positions including administrative managers, squad leaders, senior firefighters, crew members, and asst. superintendents. Pay is tiered based on experience, with hazard pay, health benefits, and pension. Predictions for the <u>2025 wildfire season in NM</u> is dire.

#### >>> **NM FOREST & WATERSHED RESTORATION INSTITUTE**

NMFWRI's Ecological Monitoring program is seeking 3 seasonal positions for Summer 2025 for graduated students with a B.S. in natural resources or equivalent experience (\$18.76+ p/hr DOE), technician aide for currently enrolled sophomores/juniors/seniors at NMHU (\$14.50-16.50 p/hr DOE) and non-NMHU juniors and seniors (\$15-16.50 p/hr DOE). Must thrive in the outdoors and work well in a team. Season spans May 11-August 16; applications reviewed on rolling basis starting March 25.

## **ROCKY MOUNTAIN YOUTH CORPS**

Colorado-based Rocky Mountain Youth Corps has adult Conservation Corps crews (members and leaders), Youth **Conservation Corps** crews (leaders for crews of kids 11-14 or 15-18), and **Natural Resource Internships** (individual placements although sometimes they work alongside a crew of interns). All opportunities are summer-only or extend into the fall.



## >>> AMERICORPS POSITION IN WATROUS, NM

Conservation Legacy's Resource Management Steward is an AmeriCorps position based at Rio Mora National Wildlife Refuge via the Bureau of Indian Affairs' WaterCorps Program. This position will work alongside refuge biologist in riparian habitat assessment and surveys of the endangered NM's meadow jumping mouse; playa lake management, and invasive species monitoring. This is a 26-week placement (~May 12 – Nov. 7). Funding for this position is secure, and includes \$3,697 education award, \$600 weekly living allowance (housing is included), \$100 weekly benefit, \$2,255 professional development.
