
"Rainstorms over NM pose flood threats again in wildfire burn scars"

June 26, 2024, Danielle Prokop, Source NM

"New Mexicans in the northern and southern parts of the state scorched by recent wildfires remain at risk for potentially intense flash flooding from storms Wednesday and Thursday... Flooding over the weekend prompted evacuations from Las Vegas and caused water contamination in the town of more than 13,000 people. In Ruidoso, multiple people needed swift-water rescues after flash flooding there last week."
