#### NM Resource Coordinator (deadline April 7)



The Western Landowner Alliance (WLA) is seeking immediate applications for a full-time, exempt, remote position (\$60k-\$75k DOE), from NM-based applicants. This is an integral team member of Working Wild Challenge efforts, including navigating conflict resolution between wildlife-livestock, establishing a NM landowner advisory group, cultivating partnerships with state and federal agencies/producers/community organizations, advocacy at state legislature, and supporting landowner needs in the western U.S. WLA is also seeking a Conservation Finance Director.


