LIFE TIP: This week, we celebrate the <u>55th anniversary of Earth Day</u>. In 1970, 20 million Americans (10% of the US population) demonstrated in the streets, and instigated the creation of the EPA, and subsequently the Clean Air Act, Clean Water Act and Occupational Safety and Health Act. This remains a robust example of how the power of the people can drive change.



Tonto Program Coordinator, National Forest Foundation (deadline: May 16)

This AZ-based work-from-home position will develop, implement and manage restoration projects throughout the Tonto National Forest in partnership with federal, state and community partners. Candidates with a strong natural resources and conservation background combined with the ability to collaborate and manage projects, are encouraged to apply for this full-time, regular, exempt position with benefits; salary range from \$63,440-\$73,008.

Project Forester, NM Forestry Division (deadline: April 29)



Use your knowledge, skills and abilities to assist private landowners and partners improve forest health and wildlife habitat, restore watershed conditions, reduce wildfire risk, utilize prescribed fire, generate income and sequester carbon. Provide technical assistance for climate change adaptations including adjustments for longer fire season, higher temperatures, prolonged drought and high-intensity storms. This is a Socorro-based position; salary range \$54,760-\$87,616.

Monitoring and GIS Specialist, NMFWRI (deadline: immediate)

Seeking a creative cartography wizard who has not lost their taste for the outdoors. This integral member of the team will work closely with the field crew in data collection and analysis (including overnight travel); manage complex datasets; supervise and provide mentorship to student workers and interns; analyze/interpret/communicate management implications of monitoring data; participate in the creation, revision and publication of training materials; provide training; and assist in project management. Salary for this full-time term appointment is \$58,656.

Statewide Planting Team Member, Tree NM (deadline: May 3)

This is an excellent early career position to grow and develop community engagement skills, drive community action through tree planting events, produce curriculum and implement training demonstrations. Salary range \$40K-45K, plus health insurance and paid time off.
