# **Fall Fire and Fuels**, Forest Stewards Guild

Fall positions for crew leads and crew members are now open in Mountainair, Pueblo of Jemez and Santa Fe. These positions include free Wildland Firefighter certification during this full-time 13-week term running from Aug 20 – Nov 14. Crew leads are paid \$20 p/hr; crew members are \$18 p/hr. Both positions have potential of OT, along with holiday/sick/cultural pay. This is a great way to get a foot in the door in wildland fire, natural resources or learn about prescribed burning.
