Ancestral Lands Conservation Corps Prog Dir., Conservation Legacy

Full-time, exempt position, partially remote eligible for applicants geographically located in Albuquerque, Gallup, Zuni, Acoma, Kykotsmovi or Flagstaff. Strong project management experience needed to direct crew operations, mentorship of program managers and coordinators, and build and deepen partnerships with land managers across the southwest (salary: \$71,900-\$74,057).

- Estimated <u>1.2 million jobs lost</u> by analysis from Center for **Human Capital Studies**
- Each federal layoff could lead to 1 other job loss in private sector
