2025 Ecology Internship, USGS NM Landscapes Field Station

Two positions – open for immediate applications – at \$550 p/wk for a 6-month placement (July – Dec. 2025) & \$500 p/wk for a 3-month placement (July – Sept. 2025). These positions include fieldwork on landscape change research, plus processing data and drafting reports. Time split between Santa Fe and Bandelier National Monument; includes housing and educational award.
