In an era of how to do the work with diminishing funding resources, here are recently announced opportunities to boost/bridge funding for your work:

- USDA-NIFA seeking proposals in <u>Foundational and Applied Science</u> (\$10K-\$10M)
- YCC 2026 Project Proposals funds projects that employ young New Mexicans (ages 14-25) to improve public spaces while providing job training (capped at \$225K; deadline: 10/8)
- CO-based projects with the <u>Forest Restoration & Wildfire Risk Mitigation</u> grant program opens for applications through 10/9
- Bureau of Reclamation <u>Small Storage Program Funding</u> reopened with up to \$43.5M available for small surface and groundwater storage projects (25% federal cost-share required). Projects proposing water storage capacity between 200 and 30,000 acre-feet (deadlines: 2/13/2026 for feasibility study; 4/17/2026 for application).
