LIFE TIP: Federal workforce <u>reductions from January through August</u> are estimated at 199,029, and federal <u>funding cuts for universities</u> and colleges are dire. <u>Cyclic sighing</u> can help calm and relieve anxiety, and at just five minutes a day, this is a practice that can result in increased effects over time.
