IN THE SPOTLIGHT

PhD and MSc Assistantships in movement ecology and Mexican spotted owl conservation with the Jones Lab at UNM, US Forest Service and LANL Labs. One (1) PhD position and one (1) MSc position will focus on habitat selection and breeding season movement. Students will be employed through LANL and be based in ABQ with spring/summer field season in Jemez. Ideal start date in March/April 2026 (deadline 1/7/26).

Conservation Connect Fellowships with the National Forest Foundation is open to enrolled graduate students for the 2026-27 academic year. This year-long fellowship runs from May 2026-April 2027, featuring a 300-hour practicum that includes applied experience with a national leader; mentorship from conservation professionals; trainings in collaborative leadership; and practical ways to expand your professional network. Fellows are compensated at \$22.90 p/hr for up to 300 hours, with reimbursable expenses for approved travel (deadline: 1/25/26).
